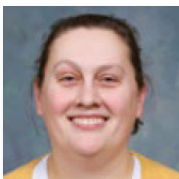

COURSE OVERVIEW:

Many physicians and physician assistants often wish they could provide local anesthetic for patients experiencing trauma or infection, yet often, they don't feel confident in their ability to perform the procedure. This course will instruct physicians and physician assistants to become competent in administering mandibular blocks, supra orbital blocks and infiltration of local anesthesia to the oral cavity. After the lecture, each participant will receive over-the-shoulder coaching as they administer local anesthesia on manikins and optionally, on each other. Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be issued a certificate of completion.
