PRESENTERS' BIOGRAPHIES

Dr. Rehman Abdulrehman, C Psych, PhD, is a clinical and consulting psychologist, working individually with clients and with larger organizations. He is the director of Clinic Psychology Manitoba and an assistant professor with the Department of Clinical Health Psychology, in the Max Rady College of Medicine, Faculty of Health Sciences at the University of Manitoba. Dr. Abdulrehman works locally and internationally, currently also a visiting professor at the State University of Zanzibar, where he teaches and consults on program development in low resource settings. He is a specialist in CBT, with a focus on anxiety and anxiety related disorders, trauma, and cross cultural issues.

Dr. Ruth Lanius (Keynote Speaker), MD, PhD, Professor of Psychiatry is the director of the posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) research unit at the University of Western Ontario. She established the Traumatic Stress Service and the Traumatic Stress Service Workplace Program, services that specialize in the treatment and research of PTSD and related comorbid disorders. She currently holds the Harris-Woodman Chair in Mind-Body Medicine at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at the University of Western Ontario. She has authored more than 100 published papers and chapters in the field of traumatic stress and is currently funded by several federal funding agencies. She has recently published a book 'Healing the traumatized self: consciousness, neuroscience, treatment' with Paul Frewen.

Dr. Jitender Sareen, MD, FRCPC, is the Medical Director for the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA) Mental Health Program and is the Head of the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Manitoba. He has received national and local peer-reviewed grants in the areas of military mental health, indigenous suicide, and homelessness. Dr. Sareen has published over 300 peer-reviewed publications in the areas of traumatic stress, anxiety disorders, indigenous suicide, psychiatric neuroimaging, and military mental health.
