Are you the first prescriber in your practice group or joining a well established group?

How comprehensive is your care?

- Full time vs. part time vs. little time
- Staff number, expertise, experience
- Location, hours
- Transport options
- **■** Clinic model
- Pharmacies, ?dispensary
- Funding model
- How connected are you?

Consider all the above when triaging complexity....

- Social
- Medical
- Psychiatric

- → HIV and Hep C
- **■** Chronic pain
- The unpleasant patient

You and Your Clinic...

- > High Tolerance vs. Low Tolerance
- ➤ High tolerance accepts many behavior problems and ongoing drug use, as long as some stability develops
- ➤ Low tolerance has strict rules may withdraw care for multiple missed appointments, needs significant notice for unplanned carry requests, no drop-in crisis services etc.
- Carry policies and urine drug screen policies often reflective of tolerance level.
- Frank team discussion important upfront and intermittently

Money \$ Money \$ Money

- Clinics with Government support vs private funding models (affiliated or owner - operated pharmacies)
- Salaried physicians/NP's vs. Fee For Service vs. Hourly/Sessional Rate
- Income expectations vs. MB Billing codes for quality care
- Typically workload exceeds FFS alone in context of quality care

Things to consider starting out...

"Enthusiasm take you so far, Resources takes you further"

Be realistic about your care burden and the burden of those around you







The prescribing approval process...

- Prescribing approval for methadone with buprenorphine/naloxone for pain/palliation separate training and approval processes
- Physicians and Nurse Practitioners in MB are eligible for prescribing approvals for methadone and buprenorphine/naloxone for Opioid Use Disorder
- 2 Alternate routes for buprenorphine/naloxone only prescribing approval for physicians only
- Coordinated effort by CPhM, CPSM and CRNM to handle training, mentoring/support and audits of all prescribers and pharmacists in an interdisciplinary fashion; apply same standards to all.
- Hopefully enriching the training process and improving patient care.
- Prescribers: a) Letter/form with references
 - b) Choose and declare your route!!!!
 - c) 2 Handouts

CPSM standards process

- Both approvals renewed every 3 years (based on active practice activity)
- ➡ Intermittent Audits / Group Audits
- Periodic OAT provider questionnaire
- PD requirement (a portion of annual CPD should be focused on OAT or addiction in general)
- Monthly review of all methadone, buprenorphine/naloxone deaths (patients on OAT and deaths secondary to diversion)
