+ Prepare

Cleanse and dry the skin. Ensure it is free of excess hair, dimethicone and other emollients.

To help protect intact or damaged skin, consider using a liquid skin barrier such as NO-STING SKIN-PREP $^{\diamond}$ before applying the dressing.



+ Apply




Select the dressing size to suit the patient, ensuring the dressing pad will cover the area to be protected.



Remove the middle liner first.



Fold with adhesive side down and place narrow end at least 2 centimeters above anal sphincter.



Separate the gluteal cleft to ensure complete contact.




Remove remaining liners.



Smooth from midpoint of dressing outward.

+ Inspect for prevention only*



Lift the border from the top of the dressing and peel downward just enough to inspect the skin; leave the dressing intact in the gluteal cleft.



After inspection, smooth the borders back into place, ensuring there are no ridges, folds or air pockets.



Regular skin inspection is important when using the dressing as part of a pressure injury prevention protocol.⁵



Do not roll the edge of the border back onto itself.

+ Remove



Lift from the top or proximal edge and peel down slowly toward the anus.



When used for wound treatment, change the dressing with each wound assessment. Do not reapply the used dressing.
