





Opioid Agonist Therapy Approved Preceptorship & Contact Information

For Methadone & Buprenorphine/Naloxone Approval

For Physicians and Nurse Practitioners

After completion of the two-day workshop, <u>Opioid Agonist Therapy 101: An Introduction to</u> <u>Clinical Practice</u>, you are required to complete a preceptorship consisting of four half-days of clinical training spent with an approved, experienced methadone and buprenorphine/naloxone prescriber. You are responsible for arranging this yourself utilizing the contact information provided below.

You may complete the four half-days under the supervision of one or maximum two different prescribers. Different methadone and buprenorphine/naloxone prescribers and/or clinic settings have the advantage of exposing you to different practice styles and clinic models.

Ideally your preceptorship should be completed within six months of attending the two-day Opioid Agonist Therapy 101 Workshop. Your supervising prescriber(s) will not be required to send a formal letter of support after completion of your preceptorship. However, they are asked to report any significant concerns to the Medical Consultant of the Prescribing Practices Program (Dr. Reinecke) if warranted. Your regulating college (CPSM or CRNM) may address such concerns by recommending further 1:1 training and/or clinic time.

<u>CPSM registrants</u>: After completing your preceptorship, please e-mail a list of your clinics, including the dates and name(s) of your preceptor(s), to the Medical Consultant of the Prescribing Practices Program (Dr. Reinecke) at <u>MReinecke@cpsm.mb.ca</u>.

Dr. Reinecke, on your behalf, will provide confirmation to the CPSM Registrar that you have completed the required training for your methadone and buprenorphine/naloxone prescribing approvals. CPSM will then process your prescribing approvals. You will receive a letter from the Registrar confirming that you may start prescribing methadone and buprenorphine/naloxone for the purpose of Opioid Agonist Therapy (OAT).

<u>CRNM registrants</u>: Complete Part B of the <u>Methadone Prescribing for Opioid Use Disorder</u> <u>Application Form</u> and submit it to <u>practice@crnm.mb.ca</u>. You will receive an email from CRNM confirming your methadone prescribing privileges. For Buprenorphine/Naloxone Approval Only

For Physicians Only

Physicians seeking a prescribing approval for buprenorphine/naloxone only, without methadone, who are pursuing Route A (see the **OAT Approval Training Process** document, which can be downloaded from this <u>CPSM webpage</u> for details) are required to complete preceptorship consisting of a minimum of one half-day of clinical training spent with an approved, experienced buprenorphine/naloxone prescriber. You are responsible for arranging this yourself, utilizing the contact information provided above. If Route A is pursued, after the half-day is completed, you also need a **formal mentor identified for the first year prescribing buprenorphine**. This mentoring physician must simply be willing to provide you with guidance as needed during your first year in OAT practice.

Ideally your preceptorship should be completed within 3 months of completing one of the approved buprenorphine/naloxone online courses. Your supervising prescriber(s) will not be required to send a formal letter of support after completion of your preceptorship. However, they are asked to report any significant concerns to the Medical Consultant of the Prescribing Practices Program (Dr. Reinecke) if warranted. CPSM may address such concerns by recommending further training and/or clinic time.

After completing your preceptorship, please e-mail a list of your clinic(s), including the dates and name(s) of your preceptor(s), to the Medical Consultant of the Prescribing Practices Program (Dr. Reinecke) at <u>MReinecke@cpsm.mb.ca</u>. **Also provide the name of your mentor** for your first year of OAT practice.

Dr. Reinecke, on your behalf, will provide confirmation to the CPSM Registrar that you have completed the required training for your buprenorphine/naloxone prescribing approval. CPSM will then process your prescribing approval. You will receive a letter from the Registrar confirming that you may start prescribing buprenorphine/naloxone for opioid use disorder.

For Nurse Practitioners Only

Nurse practitioners can obtain a notation to prescribe buprenorphine/naloxone only (without methadone) after completion of one of the approved buprenorphine/naloxone courses. Nurse practitioners interested in a buprenorphine-only notation are required to complete preceptorship consisting of one half-day of clinical training spent with an approved, experienced buprenorphine/naloxone prescriber. You are responsible for arranging this yourself, utilizing the contact information provided above. You also need a **formal mentor identified for the first year prescribing buprenorphine**. This mentoring prescriber must simply be willing to provide you with guidance as needed during your first year in OAT practice. Registrants also need to continue to demonstrate <u>Practice Expectations for RN(NP)s.</u>

Ideally your preceptorship should be completed within 3 months of completing one of the approved buprenorphine/naloxone online courses. After preceptorship, complete the Buprenorphine Prescribing for Opioid Use Disorder Application Form and submit this with your mentor's name and certificate of completion to practice@crnm.mb.ca. You will receive an email from CRNM confirming your buprenorphine/naloxone prescribing privileges. For Methadone & Buprenorphine/Naloxone Dispensing

For Pharmacists Only

Preceptorship consisting of clinical training of one or more half-days with an experienced methadone and buprenorphine/naloxone prescriber is optional. If you would like to participate in clinical training, please contact one of the approved physicians listed above. Pharmacists do not need to provide confirmation of completed clinical training to CPhM at this time, but must document the dates and times of additional training. Please see the CPhM website <u>www.cphm.ca</u> for information on accreditation of clinical training.
